


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Who Are We

East Dunbartonshire Psychological Service is part of the Community Directorate Education Service.

The Psychological Service assists the Council to address the National Priorities in Education through the application of psychological knowledge and skills.

What Do We Do

Each school in East Dunbartonshire Council has a link Psychologist who provides support to staff. Access to the Psychological Service is mainly through schools. Where a parent has a concern related to their child's learning, or to any other issue related to the school, it is helpful for this to be raised with the Head Teacher in the first instance.



Access to the Psychological Service

The East Dunbartonshire Psychological Service has five core functions:

- \cdot Consultation
- · Assessment
- \cdot Intervention
- · Training
- · Research

We work collaboratively with educational establishments and families to support children and young people aged from birth to 19 years, mainly in relation to school based issues. We also give advice to the Head of Education on the support needs of individual young people

and on policy matters.
