PREMISES RISK ASSESSMENT POLICY

RATIONALE

Risk assessment is essential within the early years establishment to ensure the safety and well being of all children and adults.

AIM

The aim of Killermont Primary Nursery Class is to consider what could cause injury or harm, and what preventative or protective measures are in place to prevent this.

OUTCOMES

- Adequate training on risk assessment should be provided for staff.
- Hazards and significant risks are identified in the early years establishment and details of risk assessments are on display at all times.
- Risks are eliminated or reduced.
- Clear procedures and controls are established and on display at all times.
- Procedures and controls are monitored.
- New staff members and supply staff are required to familiar themselves with risk assessment procedures

• EDC provide training and guidelines on Risk Assessment

HEAD OF CENTRE

 Head of Centre will have overall responsibility for the implementation and monitoring of Health and Safety Policy, including Risk Assessment

• All staff are responsible for creating and maintaining a safe working environment and should be familiar with potential risks and control procedures.
